

3. Chinook Salmon\* (*Oncorhynchus tshawytscha*)
4. New Zealand Mud Snail\* (*Potamopyrgus antipodarum*)
5. Smallmouth Bass (*Micropterus dolomieu*)
6. Yellow Perch (*Perca flavescens*)
7. Walleye (*Sander vitreus*)
8. Daphnia (*Daphnia sp.*)
9. Common Carp\* (*Cyprinus carpio*)
10. Zebra Mussel\* (*Dreissena polymorpha*)

\*Species nonindigenous to the Great Lakes, many of which are considered invasive or a nuisance.
